Nurse-Family Partnership

The Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) is a nurse home visiting program that helps eligible first-time parents experience healthy pregnancies, learn how to take good care of their babies, and make plans for the future. Home visits by registered nurses promote the physical, cognitive, and social-emotional development of the children and provide general support as well as instructive parenting skills to the parents. Services are provided to the families prenatally until the child reaches two years of age.
